HSE Board selects Hagerman Group

The Hagerman Group has been selected to be the "Construction Manager as Constructor" for the new, as yet unnamed, Hamilton Southeastern elementary school to be built on Cynthianne Road and Southeastern Parkway. The School Board approved Hagerman in a unanimous vote. HSE officials are hoping site preparation can begin on the new school as soon as November of this year.

In other school board items from the Wednesday evening meeting:

- The proceeds of the land sale at 131st Street and Cumberland Road will be set aside in what is called a "Donation Account" aimed at matching money raised by local Parent Teacher Organizations (PTOs) for projects such as building and upgrading playgrounds.

- A cell tower contract with Central States was OK'd by the board. The tower will be constructed near Sand Creek Elementary School and will generate \$10,000 per year in income to the school corporation, plus, the school system will receive 50 percent of any income gleaned from another carrier signing on to utilize that tower.

- Final approval was given to the new suicide awareness program, conforming to changes in state statutes.

- Superintendent Allen Bourff told the board attorney David Day is working with county officials to study changes in population that could require redistricting of the four school board member districts. There is not enough data yet available to determine whether redistricting is needed. The last redistricting was done in 2014.

Fishers acts to limit U-Turns on 116th Street near IKEA

Motorists will be prevented from making U-Turns on 116th Street in the area of IKEA Way, just east of Interstate 69, following action Monday afternoon by the Fishers Board of Works and Public Safety. City Engineer-

ing Director Jeff Hill told the board the placement of "No U-Turn" signs will prevent those turning right from Portillo's to make a legal U-Turn at the traffic signal on IKEA Way in order to access I-69.

Hill said there will be signage directing drivers to correctly navigate toward I-69.

The board also acted to of-

ficially set the speed limit on Atlantic Road near I-69 at 35 miles-per-hour.

In other action, the board accepted a \$930,700 bid from Wilhelm Construction to build a 10-bay parking garage at the city's Wastewater Treatment Plant. The garage is being built to protect vehicles and allow temperature sensitive

equipment to be utilized year round.

A proposed \$550,000 contract with Ratio Architects to design improvements in the area of City Hall, mainly around the area between the Amphitheater and City Hall, was pulled from the agenda at the last minute. No reason was given.



Boys tennis sectional

Carmel wins again, Fishers gets first-ever title

The Carmel tennis tradition added another championship Thursday, as the No. 1-ranked and defending state champion Greyhounds boys team won its 31st sectional title.

Carmel defeated No. 10 Guerin Catholic 5-0 at the Todd Witsken Tennis Center. It's the eighth consecutive title for the 'Hounds, and the 26th in the past 27 years.

Four of the five matches went quickly, but the No. 1 doubles match went the distance. The Greyhounds' Timmy Dixon and Drew Michael were involved in a battle with the Golden Eagles' Jacob Bratton and Wyatt Metzger that was tense and spirited.


Dixon and Michael won the first set 6-4, with Bratton and Metzger answering the call in the second set by taking a tiebreak 8-6. The Carmel duo got an early 3-0 advantage in the third set, and held off a late comeback by the GC team to win the set 6-3.

"Nothing's ever easy," said Greyhounds coach Spencer Fields. "Guerin knows us really well and has played as a top 10 team all year in the state. I think the team did well today. We're hitting our stride, we're gaining focus, we are playing good, solid tennis, high-percentage tennis. We're minimizing our errors, and that's causing some of the scores to be better. They seem easy, but they're never easy."

While the team result had long been decided, the No. 1 doubles match was important, as it keeps Dixon and Michael in contention for the individual doubles tournament. No. 1 singles Patrick Fletchall won his match 6-0, 6-1; he is the defending champion in the individual singles tournament.

Fletchall is a four-year player for Carmel, making him a four-year sectional champion.

"It means a lot," said Fletchall. "With Guerin in our sectional, it's always tough."

The Carmel boys tennis team won its eighth consecutive sectional championship Thursday at the Todd Witsken Tennis Center. The Greyhounds will travel to Kokomo next week for the regional.

Fletchall and Dixon are the only seniors on the Greyhounds' top seven.

"We have some great underclassmen that can lead the team the next few years," said Fletchall. "So it's just good to hand off the torch to them and see what they can do."

Next up for Carmel is the Kokomo regional, to be played Tuesday and Wednesday. The Greyhounds will await the winner of the West Lafayette sectional, which will be decided today between the Red Devils and Harrison.

As for Carmel, it officially has the day off today, then will get back to work to prepare for Kokomo.

"I'm sure these guys will play tennis, a lot of them will play tomorrow, even without practice," said Fields. "But they need a rest. We've played a lot actually, so they need a rest."

Meanwhile, Fishers made school history Thursday by winning its first-ever boys tennis sectional championship.

The No. 8-ranked Tigers triumphed at the Hamilton Southeastern sectional, beating Noblesville 5-0. Fishers won all the matches in straight sets. The Tigers did get a battle at No. 1 doubles, as Ethan Fairfield and Sam Barrett were extended to 7-5 in the second set by the Millers' Ben Smith and Evan Voigt.

Fishers will next play at the North Central regional, which also takes place Tuesday and Wednesday. The Tigers will take on the No. 2-ranked Panthers in the Tuesday semi-finals. North Central won its own sectional Thursday - the 40th in school history, which is second all-time behind Munster.



Royals overcome Millers in four tight sets

Noblesville will host this year's Class 4A Sectional 8 in volleyball, and The Mill saw a sneak preview of how exciting that sectional could be on Thursday.

The Millers hosted No. 9-ranked Hamilton Southeastern, with the Royals winning in four close sets: 25-23, 25-22, 24-26, 25-23. This was Southeastern's 20th match win of the season.

"I knew it was going to be a battle going in," said Royals coach Jason Young. "We've seen a lot of Noblesville. We watched the Center Grove match where they played them tough. They're pretty battle-tested."

"Anytime we face a team in our conference on the road, it's a battle," said Young, who went on to say that this year's Miller team is one of the best Noblesville teams he's seen.

After being edged in the first set, Noblesville jumped ahead by as much as 15-9 in the second set, thanks to blocks from Lexie Almodovar and Emily Kiser. The Millers still led by 16-12 when HSE soared to a 7-0 run, taking a 19-16 lead. Meredith Phillips put down a pair of kills, and Lark Jones won a couple of points at the net.

The back-and-forth continued, with Noblesville leading 22-21 late in the set. The Royals went on another run to end it, though, with Olivia Phillips serving an ace on set point.

It was the Millers' turn to make the big run in the third set, as they scored nine unanswered points to go from being down 11-9 to up 18-11, then 19-12. Noblesville's blocking continued to be superb, and Almodovar and Claire Foster each hit kills.

Southeastern's Bria King ended the run with a kill, and Taylor Shelton served up two aces to get the Royals back into it; they were within 21-19 late. Noblesville won the next point, but kills by Shelton helped Southeastern go ahead 24-23, match point.

Kiser took care of that, however: She made a net tip to save the match point, then yet another block to give the Millers set point, which they won to take the third set 26-24.

"The way that they played, they played hard," said Young of Noblesville. "They brought some stuff up that I didn't expect and they forced us to elevate our play. It was good to see us have another test."

The fourth set was more of the same, except this time it was the Royals getting out to the lead early, then midway through the set. HSE led 14-8, then 18-12 after a Phillips kill, then 23-17.

The Millers cut that lead to 23-21, but King stepped up again, spiking another kill to give the Royals three more match points. Noblesville saved the first two before Phillips hit another kill to end the match.

Phillips put down 27 kills, with Shelton hitting 14 and King getting nine. Olivia Phillips handed out 45 assists. Jones served three aces and made 1.5 blocks, while Grace Kane scooped up 26 digs.

Almodovar finished the game with 21 kills. Alexa Roberts spiked 11 kills, with Kiser hitting nine kills and making an astounding seven blocks.

"That was probably the most fun I had coaching all season," said Noblesville coach Steve Hawthorne. "The girls really came out there, played with a lot of heart, played hard every single point. We had some struggles in the beginning, but the girls executed well and we made some great adjustments and made it a competitive match. That's the most competitive we've been against HSE since I've been here."
