A realtor with Carpenter Realtors, Schwartz developed his strong work ethic as a child in his family's store. He went from serving as a cashier while standing on a milk crate to eventually managing the store. After pursuing a business degree through Ivy Tech and Purdue University, Schwartz became the sales manager for a large automotive dealership and moved into a dis-

trict management role for U-Haul before becoming a realtor. He has also served as a reserve officer with both the Noblesville Police Department and the Hamilton County Sheriff's Department.

His candidacy is the latest example of his commitment to ensuring that the community where he was raised continues to be attractive to families and businesses. Schwartz serves on the board of Keep Noblesville Beautiful and has been an active volunteer with White River Rescue and other local non-profit organizations. "It's important to me to preserve Noblesville's history and traditions while

## County Commissioners will consider plan for resort near Koteewi Park

A seasonal resort near Strawtown Koteewi Park will be considered by Hamilton County Commissioners in their regular meeting Monday afternoon. Proposed by Bruce Oldham, the 55-acre project, if approved, will include a small lake, campgrounds, rental cabins and eventually commercial businesses.

Located west of State Road 37 at Essig Road, the planned project is called

Strawtown Resort Planned Unit Development (PUD). Construction of the lake and eight cabins will begin next year. The proposed PUD comes to commissioners with a favorable recommendation from the county plan commission.

The facility, near the county's popular Koteewi Park, will presumably attract visitors to Koteewi where they can camp and buy supplies in close proximity to the county park where there is variety of attractions are offered.

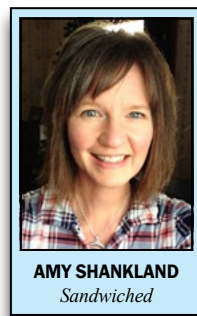
## Pride in the South Side

# Gov. Holcomb details Next Level Trails grant program

Gov. Eric J. Holcomb on Thursday announced the launch of the Next Level Trails grant program, which will dedicate \$90 million to connect communities through more hiking, biking and riding trails. Next Level Trails is part of Gov. Holcomb's Next Level Connections, a \$1 billion statewide infrastructure program announced in September.

"By linking communities, we will make a serious investment in connectivity and quality of life," Holcomb said. "Next Level Trails' strong focus on partnerships will drive collaboration among neighboring cities, towns and counties, as well as fill gaps among existing trails to create a

larger network for more Hoosiers to enjoy the great outdoors."

Next Level Trails is the largest infusion of trail funding in state history. The grant program is divided into two components: A \$70 million fund for regional projects and a \$20 million fund for local projects. Each fund will require a minimum 20 percent project match, which can include monetary contributions, land value and in-kind donations of materials and labor. Projects funded through this program must be open to the public.

"We've seen trails positively impact communi-

ties of every size across Indiana over the past decade," said Cameron Clark, Department of Natural Resources director. "The Next Level Trails program will build upon these successes by developing many miles of trails at an accelerated pace to benefit more Hoosiers and their hometowns."

Next Level Trails funds will be awarded in rounds until all funds have been allocated. The opening round will include up to \$20 million in regional projects and up to \$5 million in local projects. The application period for the first round begins Jan. 1, 2019 and

ends Feb. 15, 2019. Eligible applicants include units of government or 501(c)(3) non-profit organizations.

Those interested in applying are encouraged to attend one of the three application workshops:

- Dec. 12 at Fort Harrison State Park Inn in Indianapolis (also offered via a webinar)
- Dec. 19 at Potato Creek State Park near North Liberty
- Jan. 9 at Falls of the Ohio State Park in Clarksville

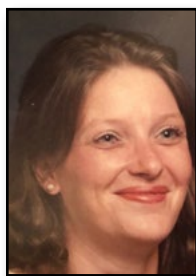

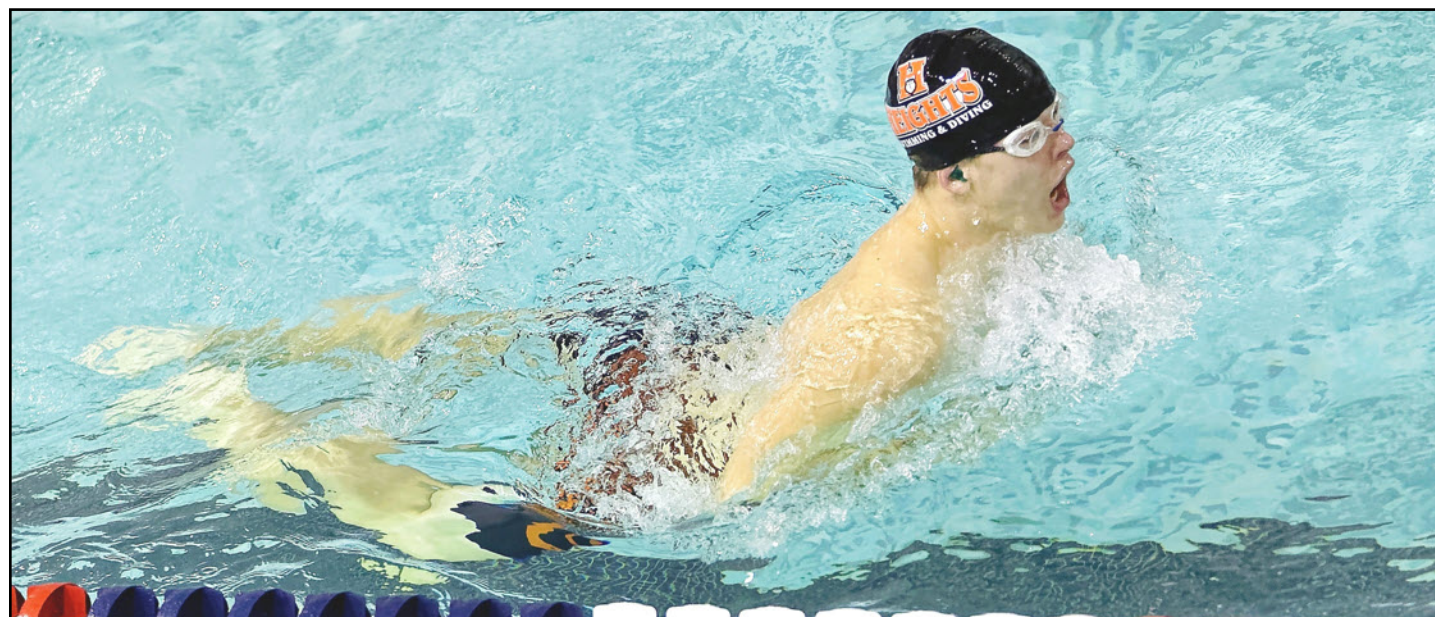

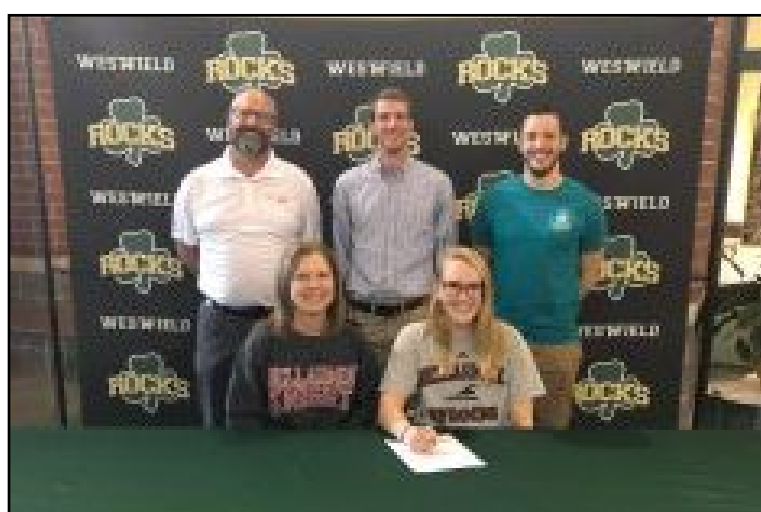
