Hamilton County Harvest (HCH) Food Bank is sponsoring its fourth year of Meating the Need, a partnership between the Hamilton County Harvest Food Bank and 4-H beef, dairy and swine project members.

HCH will purchase seven beef and dairy cattle and seven swine at the Hamilton County 4-H Livestock Auction, which takes place on July 23. In the past three

years, 9,306 pounds of meat has been distributed to food pantries in Hamilton County. This has provided the protein requirements for 37,224 meals.

This year there are 13 4-H members who will sell their livestock to benefit Meating the Need.

## Browning Chapman relocating to Westfield

Westfield Mayor Andy Cook and executives with Browning Chapman, LLC, a specialty contracting firm, announced on Tuesday the Indianapolis-based company will relocate its headquarters and warehousing facility to Westfield.

"I am thrilled to welcome Browning Chapman to Westfield," said Cook.

"With \$6.5 million in annual salaries projected from this firm, I can assuredly say that these are quality jobs in a quality community. This is proof that our strategy of bringing good jobs to Westfield is working because we are building a community where businesses and families want to be."

"The BC team is extremely excited to be joining the Westfield business community," said Allan Browning, President of Browning Chapman, LLC. "When Gordon Chapman and I began searching for our new headquarters location, we were immediately attracted to the Westfield area. Recent upgrades to the US 31 corridor allow for convenient access to Indianapolis and surrounding communities, while amenities such as the Monon Trail and Grand Park offer unique recreational opportunities. We think Westfield is the perfect location for our business and our employees."

On Monday, the Westfield City Council approved a resolution granting an eight-year real property tax abatement for a new Browning Chapman headquarters in Westfield. The abatement will be phased in at 10 percent per year. The \$4 million project is projected to create 110 new jobs.

The specialty contracting company is relocating its current headquarters from Crosspoint Business Park in Indianapolis. The 67,000 square-foot building will



## Fishers to demolish IMI structures for Geist waterfront park

The City of Fishers has approved a bid of \$122,000 to demolish buildings once used by Irving Materials Inc. (IMI) next to Geist Reservoir to make way for the new waterfront park planned in the

area. The Board of Works and Public Safety voted to move forward with the bid at the Monday meeting.

The demolition will include three main building and a few smaller ones. The city plans to take the demolished concrete and crush it, producing around 4,500 tons of material to be incorporated into the construction phase of the new park.

The demolition will be financed by part of the proceeds from the sale of land by the city that currently includes a cell phone tower.

## Local artists: Arts Council grant meeting tomorrow at Palladium in Carmel

The Arts Council of Indianapolis is now accepting applications for its biannual Creative Renewal Arts Fellowship. It will award \$10,000 personal renewal grants this fall to 40 central Indiana artists and nonprofit arts administrators, and prospective arts administrators, and in a July 11 workshop at the Center for the Performing Arts.

Now in its 11th round, the Creative Renewal Arts Fellowship program is designed to re-energize and revitalize the individuals who form the core of the Central Indiana arts community.

Funded by Lilly Endowment Inc., the fellowships can be used for research, instruction, conferences, apprenticeships, travel or other experiences that help recipients explore their artistry and creative journey.

Qualified applicants must meet the following criteria:

- At least three years of consecutive residence and/or work in one of the following Indiana counties: Marion, Morgan, Boone, Hamilton, Hendricks, Hancock, Johnson or Shelby;
- Primary source of income is derived from work in dance, theater, media arts,

music, literature, visual art or multidisciplinary art forms;

- At least 10 years of experience in the arts and at least three years in which the applicant's primary source of income was employment in the arts.

Prospective applicants are encouraged to attend one of several free workshops this summer to learn more about the program and the application process. The Hamilton County workshop will take place at 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, July 11 at the Palladium, 1 Center Green, Carmel. Complimentary refreshments, including Sun King beer, will be available.

Applications are due by Aug. 16. Recipients will be notified in November and must complete their fellowship activities between Jan. 1, 2020, and June 30, 2021.

The Creative Renewal Arts Fellowship is similar to other Lilly Endowment sabbatical-type programs aimed at pastors, teachers and social service and youth workers. Since the program's launch in 1999, more than 400 grants totaling more than \$3.7 million have been awarded.

# 18-year-old steals car, drives drunk, crashes into Noblesville pond

At 5:18 a.m. on Monday, Noblesville police officers responded to the intersection of Chapel Park Drive West and Chapel Park Drive South (Noblesville) in reference to a report of a motor vehicle crash involving a car into a pond.

Officers arrived on the scene a short time later and began to investigate. Officers were able to locate the vehicle in the pond; however, the driver had left the scene but was located a short distance away. The vehicle was a 2015 Chevrolet Malibu and was allegedly taken without the owner's permission.

The driver of the vehicle was identified as Mason Timothy Battle, 18, Noblesville. Battle reported that he was traveling south on Chap-

el Park Drive South when he lost control of the vehicle and crashed into the pond.

Battle received minor injuries as a result of the crash and was treated and released at the scene. There were no other passengers in the vehicle.

At the conclusion of the investigation, Battle was arrested and transported to the Hamilton County Jail on the following preliminary charges: Motor Vehicle Theft (I.C. 35-43-4-2.5) Felony 6; Operating While Intoxicated (I.C. 9-30-5-1) A Misdemeanor; Illegal Consumption of Alcohol by Minor (I.C. 7.1-5-7-7) C Misdemeanor.

A charge is merely an accusation and the defendant(s) is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

# Shaffer suspicious of latest set of Clay Twp. improvement projects

Dear Editor:

Last month, the Clay Township Board announced a \$58.9 million set of improvement projects.

When asked for cost estimates for the 19 projects, I was told only the board secretary, Matt Snyder, could provide details and he was on vacation, unavailable by phone or email. When he returned, he referred the question to vendors who provided the following estimates:

- Fire department projects: \$17.7 million
- Parks projects: \$9.1 million
- 111th Street roundabouts: \$4.3 million

• Carmel Dad's Club facilities: \$10.8 million

• **Estimated total: \$41.9 million** (These are estimates only, and they come from vendors and are not official statements of the board, which makes no official estimates at this time.)

The board also announced plans to retire some of the \$29 million existing debt with proceeds from the sale of bonds. The board announced \$58.9 million, less the projected \$41.9 million, which leaves \$17 million for that.

The township will double its debt, rolling over prior indebted-

ness, and add \$1,700 to the average household's \$34,900 share of Carmel debt.

According to their biographic sketches on the township website, both Snyder and a second member of the three-person board, Paul Hensel, are members of the Carmel Dad's Club board of directors. Snyder also is an employee of American StructurePoint, a major city contractor.

I leave it to your readers to draw what conclusions they will. I do sense the scent of something in the air.

## Eighteen county golfers advance to match play
