Morse Lake cleanup set for July 20

Members of the Morse Waterways Association (MWA) is organizing its 15th annual lake cleanup from 8 a.m. to noon on Saturday, July 20. Volunteers are needed along the waterfront, in the water at the shoreline, and on boats and personal watercraft to gather the debris and bring it to Red Bridge Park for removal. Boats and personal watercraft of any type are needed and appreciated.

All residents are encouraged to remove and haul larger logs from in front of their property or elsewhere to the southern-most dock at Red Bridge Park, just south of the kayak launch. They may be delivered as early as Thursday, July 18, and must be securely tied to the dock or shore so they can't float out.

Volunteers pull logs out of the lake, use chainsaws to cut the logs into manageable pieces to be placed in the dump trucks and hauled away. These logs will be taken to Green Cycle in Noblesville to be recycled as mulch. Other volunteers will work along the shoreline to remove smaller tree limbs and debris and load these on a trailer to be hauled to the Red Bridge location or to the Town burn site. Last year, volunteers collected more than 10 dump trucks full of logs and debris.

Volunteers should wear old clothes and footwear and plan to get wet and dirty while making a remarkable difference that

Dotting the "I" in Fishers

You may have seen the new Fishers sign (sans the I) on the Pavilion building between City Hall and the Nickel Plate Amphitheater. It was installed in late June, but was officially unveiled in a ribbon cut-

ting ceremony Tuesday night.

The idea came from a group of fourth-grade students at Harrison Parkway Elementary School. The idea began with student involvement in plans for the Nickel Plate Trail.

The students envisioned a "Be the I in Fishers" sculpture along the trail, where residents would be invited to complete the

artwork by posing as the "I" in Fishers.

Through a grant by the Indiana Arts Commission and approval from the Fishers Art and Culture Commission, the City of Fishers worked with local artist Rachel Kavanthe to adapt the concept into a large-scale, graphic print on the side of the Nickel Plate District Amphitheater Pavilion.

ages 3 to 17 in the Sheridan community who are facing challenging life circumstances. Since its inception, SYAP has served over 350 children in Sheridan. SYAP is one of six organizations under the umbrella of Hamilton County Youth Assistance Program, which was founded in 2009.

Each YAP has the same mission to serve its community around the county.

The early intervention advocates work with local schools, police, fire, and other community leaders to accept referrals of youth and families in need. Advocates identify community resources available to these families such as food and clothing assistance, camp and recreational opportunities, mentoring, tutoring and counseling services.

discounts for fair food and a free ticket to the Indiana State Fair.

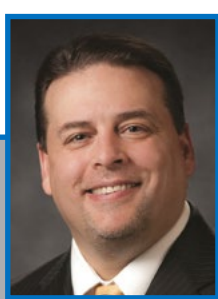

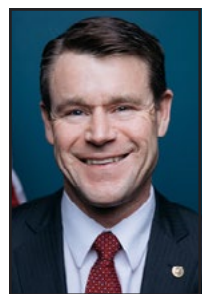

U.S. Sen. Young discusses new bill to fix America's organ donation system

U.S. Senator Todd Young (R-Ind.) spoke on the Senate floor about legislation he introduced Tuesday to bring greater accountability to the nation's organ donation system by establishing clear, accountable metrics for Organ Procurement Organizations (OPOs).

"This issue is personal for me," said Young. "My friend Dave 'Gunny' McFarland from Jeffersonville, Indiana died because his heart transplant never came. We served together in the United States Marine Corps, and over the years I've gotten to know his widow Jenni-

fer McFarland Kern. Jen has made it her mission to raise awareness about the organ transplant process and to help prevent others

from facing a similar situation. Because the system is so complex, most people don't know how it works or if patients are being protected. It's time to change that. Today's legislation is the first in a series of bills I am working on to reform our organ donation system once and for all, and help save precious lives. I won't stop until we increase the availability of organs for patients in need."

Seven local golfers make third round

Hamilton County golfers made their mark in the first two rounds of match play at the Indiana Golf Foundation's Boys State Junior Championship, which is taking place at the Purdue University Kampen Course.

Twelve golfers with county ties won their first-round match Wednesday morning, then seven of them were victorious in second-round matches later that afternoon, during which temperatures reached 94 degrees. As a result, they will play in this morning's third round, with the winners advancing to afternoon quarter-final matches.

In the first round, three local golfers needed extra holes to advance. Alec Cesare, an incoming freshman at Westfield, won his match on the 20th hole, as did Shoji Fujita, a sophomore-to-be at Carmel. Jacob Deakyne, a recent Noblesville graduate and Purdue-Fort Wayne commit, needed 19 holes to advance to the second round.

Once into the second round, all three golfers moved on to the third round in much easier fashion. Cesare won 4 & 2 over another young golfer, Valparaiso's Aidan Gutierrez - an incoming eighth-grader who qualified for the USGA Junior Amateur tournament. Deakyne beat Carmel's Clay Stirsman 4 & 3 in an all-county match, while Fujita won his match 2 up over Columbus' Henry Kiel.

Westfield's Drew Pickering, a recent Heritage Christian graduate, also won an all-county match, 3 & 2 over Fishers incoming senior Bryce Robertson. Nick Dentino, who followed up his graduation from Carmel with team and individual IHSA state championships, was a 4 & 3 winner over Kokomo's Kyle Sanders. Dentino is headed to Purdue this fall.

Two Guerin Catholic players rounded out the county's second-round winners. Incoming sophomore Connor McNeely of Noblesville beat Greenwood's Caleb Tidd 3 & 2, while Russiaville's Ty Gingerich, a recent GC graduate, took care of another Greenwood golfer, beating Sam Slaughter 2 & 1.

Stirsman advanced to the second round with a 3 & 2 first-round win over Brownsburg's Kevin Tillery, while Robertson beat a fellow Fishers player, Cathedral graduate Luke Mattingly, 1 up. Other first-round winners were Fishers graduate Caleb Bopp, Westfield's Ben Burgan, a junior-to-be at Guerin Catholic, and Fishers' Daivic Akala, who just graduated from Hamilton Southeastern.
