# Noblesville Police to hold National Night Out Tuesday

The Noblesville Police Department will play host to its third annual National Night Out event from 5 to 7 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 6 at Federal Hill Commons, 175 Logan St. This year's event is presented by Martin & Martin Insurance.

"This has always been a popular event in the past and we look forward to another great turnout this year," said Sgt. Matt McGovern, event organizer. "Children are often interested about police work and this is a great way for kids to see who we are and interact with the vehicles we use. It's also a great opportunity for adults to ask questions and find out what services we provide."

Guests at this year's event can learn about crime scene evidence collection and crime prevention information, experience the "drunk goggles," and see the department's boat, bicycle, motorcycle and SWAT vehicles. The NPD information tent will have materials on bullying, cyber safety, identity theft and home safety – along with stickers and dog tags. Other activities for children include inflatable bounce houses, a Dunk-A-Cop dunk tank and a Race-A-Cop bicycle race. Free hot dogs, popcorn and water will be available while supplies last.

National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie to make our neighborhoods safer, more caring places to live.

"This event provides a great opportunity to bring police and residents together under positive circumstances," said Noblesville Police Chief Kevin Jowitt. "The safety of our community depends on both law enforcement and the neighbors they serve. National Night Out enhances that cooperation."

After trying for months, I finally had the chance to check out the Memory Café at Conner Prairie a couple of weeks ago. Memory Café is a welcoming, safe space for individuals with Alzheimer's or any type of dementia and their caregivers.

Memory Café themes center on music from days past. Participants take a short walk to one of the museum's historic buildings to do some 19th century hearth cooking, visit the many farm animals, or dip beeswax candles. Conner Prairie provides carts to those who need them.

I actually thought the café was more of a resource fair, so I attended without my mom. I didn't take part in the activities, but I did get a chance to chat with the lovely Mindy, an enthusiastic Dementia Friends volunteer. Dementia Friends partners with Conner Prairie for this great event, which is held every other month.

Mindy volunteers for the organization in honor of her grandmother. Dementia Friends Indiana seeks to advance education and awareness of dementia, reduce the stigma associated with the disease, and create community environments that are welcoming and conducive for those living with dementia.

I had wanted to attend the café to expand my knowledge about dementia in order to understand what my mother is going through. Mindy gave me various pamphlets to point me in the right direction.

I hopped on the Dementia Friends Indiana website later that afternoon ([DementiaFriendsIndiana.org](http://DementiaFriendsIndiana.org)) and watched their series of online videos. I learned a lot about dementia, which is a general term for conditions such as Alzheimer's and other diseases that cause problems with memory

# Fishers approves bid to remove Nickel Plate rails

The City of Fishers wasted no time in approving the bid removing the railroad tracks along the Nickel Plate. Once the other local government approvals are done, it is expected that 30 days later, crews will begin removing the tracks.

The City of Fishers expects to begin the first phase of construction on the Nickel

Plate trail this fall. The project is funded through a bond issued as part of the 2019 city budget.

The Fishers Board of Works and Public Safety officially approved acceptance of the bid at a meeting Wednesday afternoon.

In addition to Fishers, the Noblesville Board of Public Works and Safety and the Hamilton County Commissioners will also vote to approve the contract to remove rails.

Noblesville is expected to vote on Tuesday, Aug. 13.

The Hamilton County Commissioners have not indicated when they will vote on the contract.

# Noblesville firefighters quickly prevent house fire from spreading

"It's not just great for this facility; it's great for the whole town. I mean they've got all kinds of exposure. Everybody knows Colts camp is in Westfield, so I think it's huge," Silvey said.



## Indiana State Police seeking recruits for 80<sup>th</sup> Academy

The Indiana State Police is now accepting applications for the 80th Recruit Academy.

Individuals who are interested in beginning a rewarding career as an Indiana State Trooper must apply online at [in.gov/isp/2368.htm](http://in.gov/isp/2368.htm). This website will provide a detailed synopsis of the application process as well as information on additional career opportunities with the Indiana State Police.

Applications must be submitted electronically by 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 3. Applications submitted after the deadline will not be accepted for the 80th Recruit Academy.

Basic Eligibility Requirements and consideration factors for an Indiana State Trooper include:

1. Must be a United States citizen.
2. Must be at least 21 and less than 40 years of age when appointed as a police employee. (Appointment date is Oct. 1, 2020.)
3. Must meet a minimum vision standard (corrected or uncorrected) of 20/50 acuity in each eye and 20/50 distant binocular acuity in both eyes.
4. Must possess a valid driver's license to operate an automobile.
5. Must be willing, if appointed, to reside and serve anywhere within the State of Indiana as designated by the

Superintendent.

6. Must be a high school graduate as evidenced by a diploma or general equivalency diploma (GED).

The starting salary for an Indiana State Police Department Recruit is \$1,615.39 bi-weekly during the academy training. At the completion of academy training, the starting salary is \$48,000 a year.

Recruits of the 80th Recruit Academy are offered an excellent health care plan, which includes medical, dental, vision and pharmacy coverage for both current and retired employees, along with their families, until reaching age 65. The Indiana State Police pension program provides a lifetime pension after 25 years of service.

Additionally, the Indiana State Police Department provides comprehensive disability coverage and a life insurance program. Student loan forgiveness programs are being offered at this time – [click here](#) for more information.

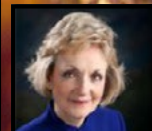


