# Westfield reports fourth year in a row of reduced crime

The City of Westfield has announced its crime rate decreased for the fourth consecutive year. This is key highlight in the Westfield Police Department (WPD) 2019 Annual Report.

“Keeping our community safe is a priority,” said Westfield Mayor Andy Cook.

“I am confident in the men and women who make up the Westfield Police Department. Day in and day out, they show their dedication to protecting and serving this community. The fact that our crime rate decreased yet again is further proof of this commitment to excellence.”

“As our department grows, we have shown that we can manage transition,” said Westfield Police Chief Joel Rush. “Our team, whether they have been a member of the department for years or are new to the city, meets and exceeds the demands of being the fastest growing city in Indiana.”

In 2019, Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) decreased, for the fourth year in a row, from 562 to 501.

UCR is a national statistical account of data on crime in a specific area conducted by the FBI. Westfield also saw a decrease in homicides, burglaries, simple batteries and thefts.

WPD also reported on the continued success of the Police Substations and Directed Patrols program in partnership with Westfield Washington Schools. The goal of the program is to provide enhanced security and consistent police presence at all schools in the district by encouraging officers to visit a school substation in their assigned patrol district to complete office-related tasks.

# Mayor Jensen points to future of Noblesville’s economy, infrastructure in inaugural address

Plans unveiled include two new downtown redevelopment projects

Noblesville Mayor Chris Jensen delivered his inaugural “State of the City” address last Thursday to a record-setting crowd at the Noblesville Chamber of Commerce luncheon at Embassy Suites’ Conference Center. Jensen focused on “Noblesville’s Next Chapter” and unveiled new economic development projects taking place in the city:

- The City of Noblesville and Xandenco, LLC have agreed to partner on a new downtown redevelopment project. The Lofts at Tenth, a \$7.7 million project, will add 31,700 square feet of mixed-use redevelopment along 10th Street between Clinton and Wayne streets. This project will increase

the downtown livability and provide immediate density and energy along with 8,000 square feet of commercial and retail space. Unique below-street-level commercial and restaurant space keeps with the historic feel of the architecture.

- In an effort to connect downtown and west side, the Village at Federal Hill is a livable, walkable connection between downtown. The project consists of 163 living units, 36,000 square feet of commercial retail space and 437 proposed parking spaces with a combination of surface, on-street and structured garage spaces.
- India-based Panacea plans to build a new 60,000 square-foot facility along the Interstate 69 corridor at

141st Street and Olivo Road in Noblesville. The company’s North American headquarters plans to employ 65 full-time employees in the new headquarters by 2023.

Panacea manufactures modern radiotherapy machines to diagnose and treat cancer. The groundbreaking is set to begin in summer 2020.

Jensen also discussed the city’s infrastructure and future road improvements – most notably the necessity to move forward on the expansion of Pleasant Street from State Road 37 to Hague Road.

The city and the Indiana Department of Transportation have an infrastructure

# Contracts awarded for State Road 37 upgrade

Changes made for parking garage

Construction contracts have been awarded on two new interchanges on State Road 37, and work has begun at the 126th Street intersection with 37. This is the first of a massive plan to upgrade 37 to a freeway style highway without stop-and-go signals from Noblesville to Interstate 69.

Reith-Riley Construction has begun work at 126th on a project that will necessitate closing access to 37 from the west next month. When work is completed on the west lane of the new roadway later this year, access from the east will then be halted temporarily.

The \$22 million project will be followed by a reconstruction of the 146th and 37 intersection, also to be undertaken by Reith-Riley at a cost of \$29.8 million, according to County Highway Director Brad Davis.

Work at the 146th Street site will get underway this summer.

Davis said bids were reasonably close to estimates and reports of giving up a full interchange at 141st Street to save money is only an option should future bids exceed estimates.

The overall 37 upgrade will proceed for the next three years. Total cost was originally estimated to be about \$125 million.

# Farming remains major industry in Hamilton Co.

An interesting publication by the Hamilton County Farm Bureau caught my eye this week when visiting the county courthouse. Included in statistics from the Farm Bureau is the fact that half of the county's 400 square-mile area is devoted to farming despite all the residential and commercial development.

The information tells an interesting story about agriculture in our county. For example, the market value of farm products is about \$100 million annually, which makes farming probably our biggest purely local industry.

There are now about 325,000 people living in Hamilton County with most of them in the southern half. There are only 585 working farms, most of them north of 196th Street, which is the county's north/south division line.

Most years at least 50,000 acres are devoted to corn production, nearly 60,000 to soybeans and around 1,200 acres of wheat. The remainder is pasture and woodland.

While figures are two years old, the report says 8.3 million bushels of corn are produced in the county, 3 million bushels of beans and 84,000 bushels of wheat.

Total net income to farmers annually is listed at \$29.9 million. The assessed value of the county's farmland was placed at \$233 million two years ago, and property taxes paid on this ground was a little over \$4.3 million each year.

It's probably all rather surprising for folks who have come to think of Hamilton County as being suburban. In fact, virtually half the county is still highly productive, rural farm country.

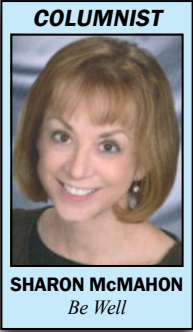
# Take time to take it easy for your health

Ah, stress. We live in a world of it don't we? Some of it due to our own making; some (much) due to outside influences. We are tethered to the outside world with little downtime. We constantly check phones, email, Facebook and various social media or the 24-hour news cycle.

We know we are stressed, but we seldom think about the cost to our health. That nagging headache, frequent insomnia, or decreased productivity at work or home – all of it may be the result of that culprit STRESS. Children, sadly, are experiencing more stress at younger and younger ages.<sup>1</sup>

As February is heart health awareness month, let's look at the effects of stress on the cardiovascular system. Heart attacks, stroke and hypertension all continue to rise in America and have become the number one cause of death. Frequent or chronic stress makes your

heart work too hard for too long, raising your risk of hypertension and problems with your blood vessels and heart, and putting you at higher risk of having a stroke or heart attack.

Is there a "higher purpose" for stress that I have not mentioned? Of course, if we are in a situation which induces a "fight or flight" response the release of cortisol serves a very important purpose.

When you encounter a perceived threat – a large dog barks at you during your morning walk, for instance – your hypothalamus, a tiny region at the base of your brain, sets off an alarm system in your body. Through a combination of nerve and hormonal signals, this system prompts your adrenal glands, located atop your kidneys, to release a surge of hormones, including adrenaline and cortisol. Adrenaline increases your heart rate, elevates your blood pressure and boosts energy supplies. Cortisol, the primary stress hormone, increases sugars (glucose) in the bloodstream,

enhances your brain's use of glucose and increases the availability of substances that repair tissues.<sup>2</sup>

Cortisol also curbs functions that would be nonessential or detrimental in a fight-or-flight situation. It alters immune system responses and suppresses the digestive system, the reproductive system and growth processes. This complex natural alarm system also communicates with regions of your brain that control mood, motivation and fear.

The body's stress-response system is usually self-limiting. Once a perceived threat has passed, hormone levels return to normal. As adrenaline and cortisol levels drop, your heart rate and blood pressure return to baseline levels, and other systems resume their regular activities. But when stressors are always present and you constantly feel under attack, that fight-or-flight reaction stays turned on.

Cortisol and the stress response have known deleterious effects on the immune system. High levels of perceived stress and increases in cortisol have been found to lengthen wound healing time in healthy, male adults.<sup>3</sup>

It's not quite that simple, is it? We can't tune out the "world" completely. We can, however, make a conscious effort to turn off the electronics, focus on breathing deeply, perhaps pray or meditate, get outside and take in the fresh air, or just do nothing every day for 10 to 15 minutes.

If you have a teenager in your home who takes their cell to bed with them, my suggestion is to change the rules ... yes parents, you are allowed to do that. Take care of your heart and *"Take It Easy"* friends!

# Riverview Health patient names disclosed in error

Riverview Health says it is taking the appropriate steps to notify approximately 2,610 patients about a mailing error that may have exposed patient names. No Social Security numbers, financial information or bank account numbers were exposed.

Riverview Health engaged its printing-mailing vendor, Priority Press, to send out patient notification letters. On Jan. 14, Riverview Health discovered that the patient notification letters were sent to the correct patient addresses, but with a different patient's name. As a result, a letter intended for one patient may have been sent to another individual. These letters were sent on approximately Jan. 6.

These letters did not include any

Social Security numbers, financial information, including credit or debit card numbers or bank account numbers. The letters were intended only to notify Riverview Health patients about a potential change to two primary care providers. These letters also did not include any medical information other than the fact that you may be a patient of one of Riverview Health's primary care providers.

Riverview Health is taking this matter very seriously and is identifying internal and external processes to prevent future recurrences. This includes reviewing methods in which Riverview Health and its vendors mail notifications to patients. Riverview Health believes that due to the very limited information contained in the patient notification letters, the risk of compromise or harm to patients is very low.

As required by federal law, Riverview Health is also notifying the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office for Civil Rights. Riverview Health patients impacted by this disclosure are also expected to receive letters in the mail notifying them of this incident within the next few days.

The State of Indiana has committed to pay \$100 million of the cost.

Davis appeared at Monday's county commissioners meeting to report on progress on various highway projects. Commissioners decided to postpone replacing the bridge deck on the Carigan Road bridge until fall after business owners in the area asked for a delay.

A contract with DHA Consultants for planning improvements to 236th Street from U.S. 31 to Deming Road will be signed soon, Davis said. The improvements include widening traffic lanes by about two feet, lowering elevation on a hill, constructing paved shoulders and a paved pathway for pedestrians and bicycles.

Construction is already underway on this type of improvement east of Deming Road. The 236th upgrade will allow safer travel from 31 to Cicero. At 31 and 236th the Indiana Department of Transportation

has scheduled a modern interchange without stop-and-go signals, Davis reported.

Commissioners are preparing to proceed with construction of a three-level parking garage in downtown Noblesville. It will be located entirely on the north side of Clinton Street between 8th and 9th streets.

This is a change from original plans for bridging Clinton Street and having a two-level structure on both sides of Clinton. The change allows cost savings and more future options for the county property on the south, according to Commissioner Mark Heirbrandt.

The parking garage is part of a downtown redevelopment plan that involves selling county parking lots on the south side of Conner Street to developers J.C. Hart and other interests who plan a multi-use development there.

It is estimated the county will get \$4.5 million for the land.

It's Sidney again, here with part 3!

My favorite thing to do comes next! Milking! Milking is difficult and it's not an easy skill to learn; it's more of a gift, really. The bond between a doe and her milker is unbreakable. My does refuse to let anyone else milk them; if I'm sick, my mom will still get me up just to milk the girls because they refuse to let anyone else touch them. One time, I had just gotten home from the hospital and my mom brought me outside to milk the girls.

When my girls aren't pregnant and are not in milk, they eat two scoops of food altogether a day. When they're in milk, they eat one scoop of food each two times daily. That's six scoops of feed for three goats! They have a milking pecking order and if that gets messed up, they are not happy campers. Tonks always goes first, then Adaira,

and lastly Val. The most important thing when milking is cleanliness. The first thing I do is put on hand sanitizer. I then grab two non-alcoholic wet wipes to clean the udder; one to clean the entire udder and the other for the teats. I then put on more hand sanitizer and milk them out. After they're milked out, I put on lotion to keep the moisture in.

Vets aren't really involved in the goat world, unless your goat is really, really sick. Worming? Do it yourself. Shots? Do it yourself. Goat giving birth? Do it yourself. Dehorning, castrating, bloating, mastitis? Do it yourself.

Worming is really difficult, but it's necessary to keep goats healthy. Worms are becoming more and more immune to medication as the years go by, so researching and finding out which medications to use is a must. Some medications I deliver monthly, others I deliver yearly. I have to give the right medication at the right times because sometimes medications cancel each other out. A lot of

math is involved too. Goats' weights vary so I have to measure their weight to see how much they need of the wormers. And to deliver the medication, I have to straddle the goat, hold their head up, and stick a tube down the right side of the throat. Trust me, there's a technique.

My mom delivers the shots but I still had to learn how to give them. And shots hurt, so guess who has to hold the goat still while their mom shoves a needle into a powerful animal? If my mom delivers the shot wrong, my goat could keel over right then and there. Boom. Dead. If the skin around where the shot was inserted isn't rubbed and massaged, a bump could show up on the skin. Tonks had this happen to her. I had to take her to the vet and get the bump removed and now her hair won't grow back in that spot.

There's also no such thing as a goat farrier. I cut all of my goats' hooves myself. Cutting at the right angle is important. If done improperly, the goat could have severe arthritis and joint problems later in life. When the girls are pregnant, their feet can get crooked and messed up due to the extra weight they're having

to carry, so fixing that before fair time is a struggle too.

There are so many more things I do and so much more knowledge that I have on goats. I could explain pasturing, dehorning, castration, or shearing every little nick and cranny of the goat for fair time. I could explain how I have to wear all white to show. I could explain pedigrees and naming and awards. I could explain and tell you everyone I know in the goat business. I could explain how painful it is to have to sell goats that I've raised since birth, knowing I'll never see them again. I could explain what body parts to memorize and tell you what a scorecard is and how to use this knowledge in showmanship. I could tell you the maneuvers I have to do depending on where the judge is in the ring. There's so much more I could tell you but I can't fit it all into one (or three) article(s).

I have put my blood, sweat and tears into my animals. I have spent seemingly endless nights outside in the barn with my animals. I know that some of my classmates will still call me "The Crazy Goat Lady," but before you poke fun at me – understand this.

included new lighting to the railings of the bridge, which will provide a scenic and secure connection between the courthouse and Riverwalk trail on the east side and Federal Hills Commons park on the west side.

- **Parking Pilot Project** – The new parking pilot program is underway and now provides free parking available all day less than 500 feet from every downtown business. Many of these changes were suggested by downtown merchants, who played a key role in developing a balanced approach in the parking pilot after communicating their need for more parking availability.
- **Alley Activation** – The Noblesville Common Council allocated \$80,000 and the Noblesville Economic Development has contributed \$50,000 to support alley activation efforts.

partnership for the construction of five new roundabouts to improve traffic flow throughout the community by enhancing east-west connectivity. The two-phase construction is scheduled to begin in 2021 with State Road 32 and 38 and the intersection of State Road 32 and River Road. The other three will begin in 2023.

This fall, the city made improvements at Seminary Park to reinvigorate its use and make it more user-friendly for the community and citizens in that area. Improvements included a new, larger gazebo and gazebo plaza; installation of Edison lighting; landscaping; new benches and tables;

a metal archway into the park; and more shade trees, among other amenities.

Jensen introduced the Hobbs Station project, which will reintegrate the former train yard site back into Forest Park as a viable and attractive piece of the park. With 135 excursions planned in 2020 the increased potential for visitors to Forest Park for the train is over 25,000 people. This will allow Nickel Plate Express to operate out of Forest Park and make Noblesville the home of the train again.

Other highlights of Jensen's State of the City speech include:

- **NobleAct** – Jensen announced the implementa-

tion of a paramedicine program, NobleAct, which will officially launch in March. The program utilizes current community, healthcare and public safety resources to proactively identify and assist the public with non-emergency needs, health issues, and strives to maintain a healthy community. NobleAct is a multi-pronged approach based on the Community Health Assessment, public safety data analysis, trending issues, stakeholder needs and citizen feedback.

- **Logan Street Bridge** – The city and Hamilton County recently widened the bridge over the White River to accommodate sidewalks on the north and south sides and constructed a new bridge deck. The joint project added a 150-foot river overlook along the south side of the bridge. Construction also

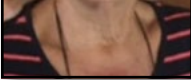

# Noblesville wins bowling state title

The Noblesville bowling team's march to a state championship in 2020 began at the state finals of 2019.

Last year's Noblesville team finished fourth in the state, but took away lessons from that day as it watched Ben Davis win the team title. Those lessons have been learned well, as Noblesville won the 2020 boys state championship, which took place Feb. 1 at Championship Lanes in Anderson.

"We watched Ben Davis take the championship that day and knew what we needed to improve on to become the 2020 State Champs," said Millers coach Jamie Elliott.

Noblesville qualified first during the team portion of the state finals, scoring a 2306. That gave the team a bye into the stepladder championship match, where it beat Terre Haute South 394-359 to win the championship.

"We worked on spare conversions all season long," said Elliott. "Much like a basketball team practices free throws I would expect. It paid off well."

Noblesville began its run to state by winning the White River Valley I sectional, which took place Jan. 10 and 11, also at Championship Lanes. The Millers also finished first in the team portion to earn a bye into the stepladder final, where they beat Elwood 457-435.

Noblesville hosted the regional at Bowl 32 on Jan. 18, where it finished third in the qualifying portion. The Millers lost in the first stepladder match to South Ripley 382-311, but still advanced to the next level.

That next level was the Kokomo semi-state, which took place Jan. 25 at Heritage Lanes. Noblesville finished fourth in the team standings, one of six teams to qualify for state and also earning another spot in the stepladder round. The Millers beat Centerville 357-301 and Terre Haute South 356-354 to advance to the championship, where they narrowly fell to Richmond 363-356.

In addition to the team success, several Noblesville individuals had good seasons as well. Five Noblesville boys and two girls

advanced to the individual regional: Nathan Smith (699) placed second in the boys, followed by James Sutton (651) in fourth and McKinley Brooks (651) in fifth. Cameron Kirby (567) was 11th and Noah Tannenbaum (559) was 14th.

Smith and Sutton advanced to the stepladder; Sutton beat Elwood's Dalton Trueblood 278-166 in the first match, then had to face his teammate Smith in the second match. Smith won 230-222 to move to the championship, where he fell to Lapel's Ryan Carpenter 257-225.

In the girls sectional, Taylor Smith placed third individually with a 599 and Lena Tarzwell was eighth with 514. Smith advanced to the stepladder, where she dropped a close 190-185 match to Alexandria's Genna Martin.

Smith rebounded at the regional, where she won the individual girls championship. Taylor was first in the qualifying with a 661, earned a bye into the stepladder final, then beat Hamilton Heights' Kylee Trexler 177-173 for the title.

Three Noblesville boys advanced to the semi-state individually: Nathan Smith was first (710), Sutton was 15th (559) and Tannenbaum was 17th (551). Smith also received a bye into the stepladder final, where he finished second to Lutheran's Ryan Speer 234-214.

Tannenbaum placed fifth in the boys singles at the Kokomo semi-state with a 648, while Taylor Smith was seventh in the girls by scoring 557. Both qualified for state as a result. At the state meet, Tannenbaum finished fourth with a 645 to reach the stepladder round. He won his first match, beating Elwood's Brayden Alfrey 221-196, then fell to eventual state champion, Clarksville's Evan Davis, 202-192 in the second match. Taylor Smith placed 14th in the girls state with a 496.

Prior to the tournament, the Millers won the conference title, finishing with an 11-1 record in the league. Noblesville also won the 2020 Indiana Bakers Classic the week before the sectional.

"This is a tournament to prepare for the State Tour-

namment," said Elliott.

Noblesville's team finished with a season team average of 998, by far the best in the state. The Millers also had the top team series with a 2242, and the third-best series with a 2196. Finally, Noblesville had three of the top six season-best games, totaling an 1131 (third), 1121 (fourth) and 111 (sixth).

Nathan Smith had the best season average among boys in the state with a 237, and was one of five boys to roll a 300 game during the season. Smith was named to the boys' All-State Second Team. Elliott pointed out that Smith is "one of only a handful of boys to hold a State Team title and a State Individual Title," as he won the individual championship in 2018.

Taylor Smith was named as Honorable Mention to the All State Girls Team and was also named to the State All-Academic Team. Smith and Tarzwell both started in the boys team's final match, making it a co-ed team for the Millers.

"This is the first time a Co-Ed team has ever done that and we are only the second Co-Ed team to win the State Boys Title," said Elliott.

Sutton had Noblesville's individual high two-game series with a 503, and his 221 average put him in the top 15 in the state. Brook

averaged 201 during conference play.

Andrew Elliott was the third-high average on the team in conference play with a 202, but had season-ending surgery prior to the start of the tournament.

"He helped lead the cheers and is already bowling again preparing for next seasons run for a repeat," said Jamie Elliott.

**OTHER SCHOOLS**

Several other schools had successful bowling seasons as well. Hamilton Heights' Kylee Trexler became the latest member of her family to win a championship, as she triumphed at the White River Valley I sectional.

Trexler qualified second in the singles with a 674, which placed her into the second stepladder match. She beat Genna Martin of Alexandria 223-196, then upset the top seed, Camryn Hickey of Lapel, 213-182 in the championship match.

Trexler placed fourth in the regional qualifying with a 578, then worked her way into the stepladder final. She beat Franklin Township's Hunter Sullivan in a tie-break, 183+40 to 183+36, then defeated Hickey 209-165 before falling to Taylor Smith 177-173 in the final.

Westfield's boys finished third at the White River Valley I sectional to qualify for the regional. In the stepladder, Elwood beat the Sham-

rocks 374-279 to advance to the championship.

Meanwhile, Carmel and Hamilton Southeastern competed in the Indianapolis NorthWest sectional Jan. 11 at Western Bowl. In the boys team competition, Carmel qualified first with a 2120, followed by Southeastern with a 2039.

Brownsburg was third with a 2015; all three teams advanced to the regional.

The Bulldogs advanced to the stepladder final over the Royals 396-288, but the Greyhounds won the sectional team championship over Brownsburg 364-324.

Carmel swept the individual sectional titles. Tyler Smith qualified third in the boys singles with a 595, then won three matches in the stepladder, beating Cardinal Ritter's Ethyn Fleischmann 189-139, Ben Davis' Sean White 209-174 and Ben Davis' Kade Metz 215-164 in the final.

Smith advanced to the regional individually along with teammate Chris Mace, who placed eighth with a 523. Two Southeastern bowlers also reached the regional: Caleb Hamilton was fifth (547) and Tanner Schindler was seventh (529).

In the girls sectional, Carmel's Casey Saas qualified first with a 537, which sent her into the stepladder final. Saas beat Brownsburg's Allison Whitmire

199-154 for the championship.

The Carmel and HSE bowlers competed with the White River Valley I teams at the Noblesville regional. The Greyhounds qualified first in the team competition with a 2239, sending into the stepladder final where they beat Columbus North 396-351 for the regional trophy.

Meanwhile, the Royals' Hamilton qualified fourth individually with a 635 to reach the stepladder round, where he fell to Metza 206-143 in the first match. Hamilton advanced to the semi-state along with Schindler, who qualified 10th (584). Carmel also had two individuals reach the semi-state: Smith placed seventh (618) and Mace was 16th (554).

At the semi-state, the Carmel team finished fifth to qualify for the state meet, scoring a 2115. The Greyhounds' Smith qualified as an individual, placing seventh with a 623. HSE's Hamilton finished 11th with a 603, also qualifying for state.

Carmel's team finished fourth in the team portion of state with a 2174, sending it to the stepladder round, where the Greyhounds lost to Terre Haute South 335-300 in the first match. Meanwhile, Hamilton placed 10th individually for the Royals, scoring a 607. Carmel's Smith was 19th with a 552.

# Carmel boys swimming sets records in state win

**INDIANAPOLIS** - It seems redundant to say this year after year: Carmel makes history at the state swim meet.

But it's always true. This year, it was more true than ever for the Greyhounds boys team. Carmel dominated the IHSAA state swimming finals last Saturday at the IU Natatorium, scoring 331 points to claim its sixth consecutive state championship. That's a record for most state titles in a row in the boys competition.

The six straight titles record is the first of several records that were re-written

at the meet. The 'Hounds established new meet record times in five events, saw one of its senior swimmers join an ultra-elite group, while another senior received a major award once the competition was finished.

"It's just an amazing performance by these guys," said Carmel coach Chris Plumb. "It's one thing to have the potential to do it, and it's a whole 'nother thing to step up and actually do it in so many races in such a short amount of time. Give these guys a lot of credit for their work in coming in it today and just swimming great."

The tone was set early, as the Greyhounds won the first three events. First was the medley relay, which senior

Wyatt Davis, sophomore Ryan Malicki, junior Griffin Hadley and senior Jake Mitchell won in a new state record time of 1:27.94.

It was just the beginning for Mitchell and Davis, two swimmers who are going to make the University of Michigan very happy over the next four years. Mitchell went first, winning the 200 freestyle race by over three seconds.

Then it was Davis' turn. He set a new state record in the individual medley, finishing the race in 1:44.17. That broke the 10-year old record of 1:44.55 set by Chesterton's Kyle Whitaker, who was a rare four-time state champion in that event,

**INDIANAPOLIS** - It was another solid year at the boys swimming state meet for Fishers and Hamilton Southeastern last Saturday, as the Tigers scored their best-ever finish and the Royals added another chapter to their great tradition.

Fishers placed fourth at the state meet by scoring 158 points, improving by one notch its highest finish at the IU Natatorium and easily scoring its biggest point total yet. The Tigers' previous best result as a team was fifth, back in 2010.

In all, Fishers totaled nine state medals. Carlile placed fourth and Frolo was fifth in the 200 free, while Ponsler took eighth in the individual medley. That trio finished the meet by teaming with junior Tyler Schwertfeger to place sixth in the 400 free relay. Two divers added to the Tigers' medal total: Sophomores William Jansen and Sebastian Otero finished sixth and seventh respectively.

The Fishers 200 free relay team won the consolation heat in that event, officially placing ninth for scoring purposes. Carlile, Frolo and Ponsler joined senior Bruno Kitazuka in that race. Freshman Connor Carlile took 15th in the individual medley.

"We just feel like we're taking some nice steps now in the program and we're excited about what the future holds," said Keller.

Southeastern picked up its 19th top 10 finish in school history by tying

Noblesville finishes fifth, posts season-best score

**NOBLESVILLE** - The Noblesville gymnastics team had a goal in mind as it hosted Sectional 2 last Friday night at Noblesville East Middle School: Get into the 90s.

The Millers did that and more. Finishing the meet with a solid balance beam score, Noblesville posted a 92.00, good enough for fifth place and by far a season-best mark.

"I'm super proud of the girls today," said Millers coach Jody Ramey. She had all the reason in the world to be proud of her team, reflecting on how far her gymnasts had come from the beginning of the season - "A lot of these girls were brand-new, beginner gymnasts coming in," said Ramey.

Noblesville was led by a freshman, Keira Harper. While she wasn't new to gymnastics, Harper took a year off before returning to competition. She finished her season strong, scoring a 32.475 in the all-around. Harper's best individual mark was an 8.70 on the balance beam, good for 11th place.

The Millers were solid on the beam as a team. Hailey Knoll scored a 7.80 and Ella Deno posted a 7.45. That added up to a beam total of 23.950, the second-highest of the four rotations.

Noblesville scored a 24.425 on the vault, an event in which it is traditionally strong. Harper earned an 8.325, Knoll posted an 8.00, and Alexis Riester and Cailey Hurst both scored 7.80.

The top three teams advance to the regional, which takes place Saturday at Portage. Harrison scored a 107.075 to win the team championship, followed by runner-up Logansport with a 104.875. Northwestern placed third with a 103.85 and also had the all-around champion: Katie Smith scored a 36.75. Harrison's Haiven Gipson had the best score of the night, a 9.60 on the vault.

"For me, it's not always about the winning," said Ramey. "It's about bringing the whole team together and being able to be united as a team and learn the discipline and learn how to better your mistakes. This team was able to do that and more."

Fishers had a gymnast compete at the sectional for the first time. Freshman Savannah Strange had a solid day in all four events, compiling an all-around score of 31.475. Strange's top score was an 8.20 on the vault.

Strange said competing was a "little bit nerve-wracking but a little bit exciting, saying that I'm the only one competing for my high school," and the overall experience was "really fun. I made a lot of friends," she said.

a winner from freshman year to senior season, 2007 to 2010.

Later, Mitchell ran away with the 500 free. He set a new state record of 4:14.68, finishing over 10 seconds ahead of second place. A few minutes later, Davis shattered his own state record in winning the backstroke, clocking in at 45.80 seconds.

That made Davis a four-time winner in the backstroke. His first victory was as a freshman in 2007, when he won it in 48.43. Davis dropped time every year in the event, and became the fourth four-time champion in IHSAA history. He joins Joe Sheehy of Columbus (now Columbus North), who won four butterfly races from 1963-66, Crawfordsville's Josh Mikesell, a backstroke champion from 1985-88, and the aforementioned Whitaker.

"It just goes to show you his dedication to his craft," said Plumb. "Just pushing the envelope and getting better every year, never being satisfied with one."

The Greyhounds finished the meet with a bang, as Mitchell, junior Gus Rothrock, Hadley and Davis won the 400 free relay. The team set a new record in that race of 2:56.56, lowering its record of last year by over two seconds. With that, the Greyhounds won their 78th event championship, breaking the long-standing record of 77 by Columbus/Columbus North.

Davis finished his career with 14 state championships, a new record for most state titles by a boys swimmer.

"First off, I just want to thank all the coaches at Carmel and just the program in general for allowing me to really access all my skills and really develop those in order to four-peat in the 100 backstroke," said Davis. "But also, just the team chemistry, it was just a lot of fun. It's just been a lot of fun training with the guys, so it just made practice a lot more fun and just being able to have fun with them, know that they're going to support me no matter what. I feel like that's a huge part of what led me to be successful."

After the swimming was done, Carmel received another honor: Mitchell was named the Herman F. Keller Mental Attitude Award, becoming the first Greyhounds boys swimmer to receive the honor.

"Honestly, I was more excited about that than any of my swims, because it just means a lot more," said Mitchell. "There's the side that we have in the water, and then there's also the side that a lot of people don't see: It's outside of the water. It just felt really good to get recognized for the life that we live outside of the water."

"Jake has come so far," said Plumb. "He's the silent worker and he just gets it done in the pool and gets it done in the classroom. Does an amazing job outside the pool. I'm just so proud of those two and Jake and Wyatt for leading this team and pulling up everybody with them."

The event wins and state records obviously get most of the attention, but Carmel's depth helped it to another team state title. The Greyhounds had 10 other swimmers earn state medals Saturday.

Rothrock placed second in the IM and fourth in the butterfly, and joined senior Brandon Edwards, Malicki and junior William Kok in taking fourth in the 200 free relay. Hadley finished third in the 100 free and fifth in the backstroke, while Malicki took third in the breaststroke and sixth in the IM.

Freshman Kayden Lancaster picked up two medals by placing seventh in the 200 free and eighth in the 500 free. Nolan Kopp finished eighth in the backstroke. In consolation heats, Kopp took 10th in the 200 free, while senior Griffin Seaver placed 12th in the 500 free and 13th in the butterfly.

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The Shamrocks finished the regular season 16-6. They will play in the first semi-final game of the Noblesville sectional Friday, taking on either Fishers or Zionsville at 6 p.m.

The Blackhawks finished the regular season 5-17. They travel to Blackford on Tuesday to play the first game at Sectional 39, taking on Tipton. Tipoff is 6 p.m.

All three of the Royals' relays earned medals. Streett and the senior trio of Evan Sellers, Marcus Eden and Rogers finished the meet with a fifth-place finish in the 400 free relay. Eden and Christopher joined two more seniors, Andrew Truxall and Connor Harrison, to start the meet with a seventh-place
