Work at the 146th Street site will get underway this summer.

Davis said bids were reasonably close to estimates and reports of giving up a full interchange at 141st Street to save money is only an option should future bids exceed estimates.

The overall 37 upgrade will proceed for the next three years. Total cost was originally estimated to be about \$125 million.

Hamilton County Sheriff Dennis Quakenbush has released the county's top three crash locations.

According to the Sheriff, two of the three locations with the most frequent crashes are located on 146th Street:

• 146th Street & Hazel Dell

• 236th Street & U.S. 31

• 146th Street & Gray Road According to Quakenbush, the main cause of accidents at these intersections were drivers following other

vehicles too closely.

Sheriff Quakenbush recommends leaving at least three seconds between you and the vehicle in front of you. He also reminds all drivers to not text and drive and to obey all traffic controls.

Farming remains major industry in Hamilton Co.

An interesting publication by the Hamilton County Farm Bureau caught my eye this week when visiting the councourthouse. Included in statistics from the Farm Bureau is the fact that half of the

county's 400 square-mile are two years old, the report area is devoted to farming says 8.3 million bushels of despite all the residential and corn are produced in the commercial development.

The information tells beans and 84,000 bushels of an interesting story about agriculture in our county. For example, the market value of farm products is about \$100 million annually, which makes farming probably our biggest purely local industry.

There are now about 325,000 people living in Hamilton County with most of them in the southern half. There are only 585 working farms, most of them north of 196th Street, which is the county's north/south division line.



Most years at least 50,000 acres are devoted to corn production, nearly 60,000 to soybeans and around 1,200 acres of wheat. The remainder is pasture and woodland.

Total net income to farmers annually is listed at \$29.9 million. The assessed value of the county's farmland was placed at \$233 million two years ago, and property taxes paid on this ground was a little over \$4.3 million each year.

It's probably all rather surprising for folks who have come to think of Hamilton County as being suburban. In fact, virtually half the county is still highly productive, rural farm country.

some (much) due to outside influences. We are tethered to the outside world with little downtime. We constantly check phones, email, Facebook and various social media or the 24-hour news

We know we are stressed, but we seldom think about the cost to our health. That nagging headache, frequent insomnia, or decreased productivity at work or home – all of it may be the result of that culprit STRESS. Children, sadly, are experiencing more stress at younger and younger ages.1

As February is heart health awareness month, let's look at the effects of stress on the cardiovascular system. Heart attacks, stroke and hypertension all continue to rise in America and have become the number one cause of death. Frequent or chronic stress makes your (glucose) in the bloodstream, time in healthy, male adults.³

Is there "higher purpose" for stress that I have not mentioned? Of course, if we are in a situation which induces a "fight or flight" response the release of cortisol serves a very important purpose.

When you encounter a perceived threat – a large dog barks at you during your morning walk, for instance – vour hypothalamus, a tiny region at the base of your brain, sets off an alarm system in your body. Through a combination of nerve and hormonal signals, this system prompts your adrenal and you constantly feel unglands, located atop your der attack, that fight-or-flight kidneys, to release a surge of hormones, including adrenaline and cortisol. > The body's stress-response system is usually self-limiting. Once a perceived threat has passed, hormone levels return to normal. As adrenaline and cortisol levels drop, your heart rate and blood pressure return to baseline levels, and other systems resume their regular activities. But when stressors are always present reaction stays turned on.

A contract with DHA Consultants for planning improvements to 236th Street from U.S. 31 to Deming Road will be signed soon, Davis said. The improvements include widening traffic lanes by about two feet, lowering elevation on a hill, constructing paved shoulders and a paved pathway for pedestrians and bicycles.

Construction is already underway on this type of improvement east of Deming Road. The 236th upgrade will allow safer travel from 31 to Cicero. At 31 and 236th the Indiana Department of Transportation land.

Commissioners are preparing to proceed with construction of a three-level parking garage in downtown Noblesville. It will be located entirely on the north side of Clinton Street between 8th and 9th streets.

This is a change from original plans for bridging Clinton Street and having a two-level structure on both sides of Clinton. The change allows cost savings and more future options for the county property on the south, according to Commissioner Mark Heirbrandt.

The parking garage is part of a downtown redevelopment plan that involves selling county parking lots on the south side of Conner Street to developers J.C. Hart and other interests who plan a multi-use development there.

Riverview Health says it is taking the appropriate steps to notify approximately 2,610 patients about a mailing error that may have exposed patient names. No Social Security numbers, financial information or bank account numbers were exposed.

Riverview Health engaged its printing-mailing vendor, Priority Press, to send out patient notification letters. On Jan. 14, Riverview Health discovered that the patient notification letters were sent to the correct patient addresses, but with a different patient's name. As a result, a letter intended for one patient may have been sent to another individual. These letters were sent on approxi-

The letters were intended only to notify Riverview Health patients about a potential change to two primary care providers. These letters also did not include any medical information other than the fact that you may be a patient of one of Riverview Health's primary care providers.

Riverview Health is taking this matter very seriously and is identifying internal and external processes to prevent future recurrences. This includes reviewing methods in which Riverview Health and its vendors mail notifications to patients. Riverview Health believes that due to the very limited information contained in the patient notification letters, the risk of compromise or harm to patients is

As required by federal law, Riverview Health is also notifying the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Office for Civil Rights. Riverview Health patients impacted by this disclosure are also expected to receive letters in the mail notifying them of this incident within the next few days.
