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Hamilton County Health Dept. confirms 1st case of coronavirus

On Sunday, the Hamilton County Health Department, in consultation with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Indiana State Department of Health (ISDH), confirmed the first case of novel coronavirus in a Hamilton County resident. The patient is currently hospitalized.
In a statement issued to the media, the Hamilton County Health Department stated they would not provide further information about the person or identify the hospital.
The county is working closely with the state health department to identify any close contacts of the patient who might have been exposed to ensure that appropriate precautions are taken in accordance with the latest

CDC guidelines.
At this time, the risk to the public is believed to be low.
The Hamilton County Health Department will continue to work with CDC, ISDH, and county partners to safeguard the residents of Hamilton County. These efforts include conducting risk assessments with partners, educating the public, and providing recommendations on mitigation strategies.
Hamilton County Health Officer Dr. Charles Harris said, “We have known COVID-19 would arrive in Hamilton County eventually. We were fortunate to have additional time to prepare for our first case. We will continue to work with our federal, state and local partners to mitigate and respond to COVID-19.”

Diagnosing and treating coronavirus

In order for doctors to diagnose coronavirus (COVID-19) they will likely take samples, including a sample of saliva (sputum), a nasal swab and a throat swab, to send for testing.
If an individual is diagnosed with coronavirus, there is no antiviral medication recommended to treat COVID-19. Treatment is directed at relieving symptoms and may include pain relievers, cough syrup or medication, rest and plenty of fluids.
Symptoms can range from a fever, sore throat, coughing, to serious respiratory tract infections.
If your doctor thinks you can be treated at home, he or she may give you special instructions, such as to isolate yourself as much as possible from family while you're sick and to stay home for a period of time. In some cases, you may need to be treated in the hospital.
Coronavirus can progress to bronchitis or even pneumonia, and some people need supplemental oxygen to help them breathe and in extreme cases may need to be placed on a mechanical respirator.
Health officials are still uncertain how long a person with coronavirus remains contagious.

Fishers-Carmel COIT deal clears General Assembly, heading to governor's desk

past several years, and the gap has been widening.
Mayor Fadness recently told LarryInFishers.com the deal reached with Carmel calls for a revised COIT distribution formula that will add \$15 million to \$18 million in additional COIT funds to Fishers over three years, but that increase is tied to a rise in COIT tax collections of 2.5 percent each year. In other words, presuming a strong economy continues locally, Fishers will receive the extra funds.
According to Fadness, after that initial three-year period, Fishers would receive \$4 million to \$6 million in additional money per year from COIT, but that would once again rely on continued COIT tax collection growth in the coming years.
According to Speaker Huston, all the provisions described to me by the mayor are included in the final version of the legislation.
The dispute between Carmel and Fishers over the state formula distributing County Option Income Tax (COIT) funds appears to be settled.
House Speaker Todd Huston tells LarryInFishers.com that a conference committee report with the language agreed to by officials of both cities has now passed both the House and the Senate and is headed to the desk of Governor Eric Holcomb. The governor is expected to sign the measure.
Fishers Mayor Scott Fadness has said that despite the fact that Fishers and Carmel have roughly the same population numbers, Carmel has been receiving significantly more COIT funds the

At the Sheridan Public Library Board meeting last Monday, an agreement was reached between the library and Marion Township Trustee Mike Morgan to provide library services to students in Sheridan Community Schools (SCS) who reside in Marion Township in Boone County.
The library will make its system available for SCS students living in Marion Township in the same manner and to the same extent as if they were residents or real property taxpayers of its library district by making use of subscription cards. The township will pay the Sheridan Public Library a fee of \$1,000 per year.
Student cards are only to be used by the student. Additional cards may be purchased at the expense of the township resident or real property taxpayer.

renewing a student card, the student or parent must provide proof of enrollment at SCS. Report cards, Power School, or a letter from the school can be used as proof of enrollment. Proof of residency of Marion Township must also be shown.

Auditor taking steps to prevent homestead fraud

Homestead fraud is a growing concern among state and local officials, as well as residents, because it affects everyone.

"Homestead fraud is a growing trend that has the potential for significant penalties and is causing higher tax bills for everyone in Hamilton County," said Hamilton County Auditor Robin Mills. "Individuals and married couples are limited to one homestead deduction, per the State Homestead law."

Fraudulent deductions steal from public safety, schools and other services. In addition, it can lower the quality of life in Hamilton County. Ultimately, honest taxpayers are left with making up the difference that homestead fraud creates.

"Tax Management Associates will be mailing letters to Hamilton County residents whose eligibility for the standard homestead deductions needs further clarification," said Mills. "Should you receive something from Tax Management Associates please know it is not fraudulent and you will want to respond as requested."

The homestead deduction gives a qualifying individual or couple a substantial property tax benefit by lowering their property tax obligation. When individuals who do not qualify receive the benefits it costs other taxpayers more. Fishers moves forward on 5G with limited legal authority

The City of Fishers will move forward with permit requests for 5G towers in residential neighborhoods using all the legal levers at its disposal, but the mayor and city attorney caution local residents that the state and federal governments have usurped most of the authority to regulate 5G technology.

City Attorney Chris Greisl told the Board of Public Works and Safety that Fishers can look at where

towers are located within a neighborhood, but cannot ban or deny all requests for 5G small cell towers based on state and federal law.

Mayor Scott Fadness said the city will notify homeowners associations (HOAs) when tower permits are under consideration, and will also notify all residents within 200 feet of the proposed pole. Those living in the area of any proposed tower will be given the opportunity to provide their views before any tower permit is decided by the Board of Works.

Fishers to fund neighborhood matching grants again this year

The City of Fishers will provide nearly \$68,000 in funding for matching grants to Fishers neighborhoods this year. The grants were once separated into the Neighborhood Matching Grant and the Tree Matching Grant, but have now been combined and renamed the Vibrant Neighborhoods Matching Grant (VNMG).

According to the city, the intent of the VNMG program is to provide mon-

ey for older neighborhoods, typically 10 years or older. Projects funded include beautification of a subdivision entrance or property along city roadways.

Over \$78,000 total was requested by 22 neighborhoods throughout Fishers. A committee reviewed all requests and submitted its recommendations to the Board of Public Works and Safety, which voted to approve the committee's work at its Monday meeting. The funds had been approved by the City Council as part of the 2020 budget.

On Wednesday morning I received a call from my mother's health campus. I knew it was time to up my level of concern. My mother turned 94 on March 14. My mom is high risk and quite vulnerable.

The call came in about 10 a.m. I was told I had four hours to get to the



Paul was the instigator of quite a few of those pranks and the victim of nearly as many. Those stories have since become somewhat of a legend and are the source of a lot of wonderful memories. After Paul's son graduated, he continued to be an active part of the booster organization for many years, following his niece through the program.

Paul also enjoyed going fishing, playing a round of golf, or just taking off on his motorcycle. He also loved watching TV. Seriously, Paul loved watching TV, especially old Westerns. When people would stop by for a visit, they better time it around his programs. If a visitor showed up while a Western was on, Paul would continue watching until it was over – then his attention would shift to visiting.

In 2001 Paul suffered a major stroke and his life would change in a big way. With the help of his loving family he was able to recover and return home. As Paul needed more constant care, he moved to a home unit at Wellbrooke of Westfield. It was the perfect fit for Paul and his family. It wasn't long before he had the run of the place. He would get on his scooter and give the nurses a run for their money. He would zoom around the halls and visit other Sheridan residents that were at Wellbrooke. Sometimes you just didn't know where you would find him.

He was a longtime member of Sheridan Six Points Church.

The sports world must be patient as it deals with the coronavirus crisis

Remember the good old days?

I remember being up at The Mill at Noblesville High School, standing up on the second level at one of the two overlooks on the east side of the gym, directly above the entrance. The radio and television people set up shop there whenever they come to cover a game. I wound up sitting next to a group of Carmel High School students who were there from the school's radio station, WHJE.

It was the second boys basketball sectional semi-final game of the night between Noblesville and Carmel. During the game, my old friend Joe Burgess came up to say hello. He wound up taking a selfie with me and posted it on Twitter.

The game was your typical Millers-Greyhounds battle to the end. Carmel won on a last-second shot after being down with about a minute to go. It was thrilling, although I have to admit that covering games between two county schools is never easy. I'm happy for the winning team, and simultaneously feel bad for the other team.

Overall, it was a sectional game to remember. The good old days. Now you might be thinking "Wait a minute, what do you mean the 'good old days?'" After all, that sectional game took

place nine days ago -- Friday, March 6.

Because after the events of this past week, nine days ago seems like forever.

DOMINO EFFECT
Nine days ago, we all had been hearing about the coronavirus, or COVID-19, for the past few weeks. While it was something to be aware of, it didn't seem like something that would disrupt everyday life.

Then it started getting serious. Avon Community School Corporation had a student test positive, and quickly announced all schools would close. On Monday, Kent Graham and I were talking about what that would mean for an indoor track and field meet scheduled for Friday that was to be hosted by Avon High School. And would Avon's closure cause a domino effect across other schools?

Indeed, the dominoes started dropping from there. College basketball conference tournaments would no longer allow fans at the games. Soon they would be canceled altogether. Then came Wednesday, when an NBA player tested positive for the coronavirus. Within hours, the NBA season was suspended. Other major sport leagues quickly followed suit.

Kent and I were preparing to head to Logansport on Saturday to cover Car-

mel in the boys basketball regional. The IHSAA said on Thursday that it would conduct games with limited fans, but that soon became unfeasible as school districts across the state, including all of Hamilton County's districts, announced they were shutting down and moving to e-learning. On Friday, the basketball tournament was postponed.

The only high school sporting event to take place Saturday was the IHSAA gymnastics state finals at Ball State University. Those girls participated at state in front of an empty Worthen Arena, as no spectators were allowed. Chesterton won the meet, its third straight state championship in gymnastics and sixth overall.

Spring sports are delayed here in Hamilton County with the closure of the schools, most of which are scheduled to be closed until the week of April 13. (Guerin Catholic is set to re-open the week of April 6, according to the calendar on the school's website.) It will be, at the very least, early to mid April before practices can begin, and several days after that before actual games and meets can be scheduled.

THINGS ARE DIFFERENT NOW

I do agree with the need to close schools. School systems are not just expected to educate our children, they also are expected to protect them and look out for their best interests, even if that means shutting the schools down.

To some people all the shutdowns -- not just of schools, but of sports, museums, other public places -- may seem like an overreaction. Possibly. But Allison Carter of the *Indianapolis Star* said it best in a tweet: "We will never know if we overreacted to the coronavirus. We will only know if we underreacted."

You can still think everyone is overreacting if you want. But here's the bottom line: Things are different now, much different from nine days ago, whether you like it or not. Terms like "social distancing" and "flattening the curve" were word salad on March 6, but they are in our lexicon as of March 15. Now we must decide how we're going to react to this situation and weather it with as little damage as possible, because we don't have much of a choice.

As a sports journal-

ist, it's my job to report on sports, and that means to sometimes view situations like this through the lens of athletics. It does seem a little frivolous to be talking about sports at a time like this. It's awful to watch what's happening across the country and around the world as well, especially in Italy, as the coronavirus takes its toll.

Those of us in the sports world, especially high school sports, have been confronted with quite a bit of disruption over the past week, as is the case with much of everyday life around the world. During the school year, everything is pretty much planned out. Conference meets on this day, sectionals on that day, and if our teams advance, regionals are here on this day. Now, that's all out the window for the foreseeable future.

STORIES TO TELL

People have asked me, "What are you going to write about?" Well, there are always feature stories. Fortunately, there are many stories to tell in an athletics-crazy county such as Hamilton. Don't be surprised if you're an athlete who graduated from a local school, is competing in college sports, and

you get an email from me during the next several days. You might have a good story to tell, and I'd be happy to tell it.

Of course, I'll make sure to keep you updated with spring schedule adjustments. And when we finally do get going with the spring sports season -- and we will -- I will be there to cover all the events again. I'm just as ready as everyone else to get outside and enjoy the spring.

But for now, we'll have to be patient. The best we can do is stay safe, use common sense when it comes to going out, wash our hands, have faith and work together. A year from now, we can all look back and wonder if we overreacted to the coronavirus, but something tells me that if we do our part to keep it as much under control as possible, we will be glad we overreacted like we did.
