

According to CCPR officials, the virus was not believed to compromise any personal or financial infor-

mation of CCPR customers. CCPR's phone system and website were also not impacted by the virus and remain accessible to the public.

CCPR is currently working with its insurance provider and IT consultants, including forensic specialists, to determine how the virus infiltrated the internal network, what information was potentially compromised, and appropriate actions to mitigate against future issues.

Representatives from Hamilton County government and the City of Carmel opened the new Lowes Way Extension last Tuesday. Motorists are now able to access 146th Street via Rangeline Road.

"The completion of this project cumulates more than 20 years of infrastructure improvements to this corridor," said Christine Altman, president of the Hamilton County Commissioners. "These improvements greatly enhance the convenience and efficiencies for all motorists in the area." Construction on the \$6.4 million project was completed three weeks ahead of schedule. The Indianapolis Metropolitan Planning Organization provided approximately \$4 million of Federal Congestion and Air Quality Funding for the project. 



Noblesville Schools first district in state to implement door barricading devices

The REPORTER

Noblesville Schools last week announced a safety enhancement aimed to further protect students and school staff as they return to buildings.

After extensive research and evaluation in partnership with the Noblesville Police Department, approximately 1,000 new door barricading devices in all schools across the district were installed this summer.

The barricading devices are new to Indiana schools and required a special hearing with the Indiana Department of Homeland Security, Fire Prevention and Building Safety Commission before being approved

They create a safe zone within school buildings during a crisis, allowing students and staff to fully secure themselves in classrooms within seconds. The device can be deactivated from within the classroom, and will still allow first responders to access the room quickly, if needed.

Students and staff will receive training and practice with the devices during regularly scheduled school safety drills.

"As state school safety leaders, we're proud of the almost 50 different safety improvements we've implemented within the last two years," Noblesville Schools Safety Director Dr. Heather Hendrich said. "These barricading devices add another important layer for keeping our students and staff protected in the event of an emergency.'

Other major safety upgrades the district has implemented recently include tripling the number of school resource officers for coverage at all times in all schools, introducing gun-detecting safety dogs, creating a full-time safety director, enhancing safety technology tools, hardening doors and windows, and implementing more rigorous visitor checks and procedures.



Katie Kuc, a senior-to-be at Carmel and Xavier University commit, tied for fourth with a score of 224. Kuc made three birdies during the tournament. Another Carmel senior-to-be, Sydney Longstreth, finished in eighth place with a 228. Longstreth had nine birdies for the tournament.

tell it to you straight....I love high school football. I spent most years of my radio

broadcasting career doing play-by-play and commentary on football and basketball at the high school level, and some small college games.

When you are so close to sports, you either stop doing it or you love it even more. My love for sports only grew through my younger years. I got to know many players, their families, coaches and athletic directors.

I found most people drawn to sports as a profession are good people. There are always exceptions, but if you don't learn to love coaching kids and getting to know their families, you don't stay in coaching for long.

When I first received a tip that a Fishers High School football player had tested positive for COVID-19 after only a few days of practice, my heart sank. For this to happen so soon was a big set-

back to the upcoming high school football season.

But, it should be noted, based on what I gleaned from a podcast conversation with local Superintendent Allen Bourff, the young man testing positive was doing well with few, if any, symptoms.

The Fishers School athletic staff should be credited with following all the protocols from the IHSAA and Fishers Health Department. Practice was set to begin again Monday for the Tigers, but the local health department will be providing advice on players working in the same group as the player testing positive.


