2021 School Corporation Annual Performance Report (APR)	
<b>General Explanations</b> The APR is a report on the performance of schools and school corporations (districts) in your area. The goal is to provide information regarding the progress schools are making to help students become college and career ready. Where possible, this report contains three years of data to show trends - not just this year's results. In addition, the state average is also shown for comparison purposes. There are additional indicators that are available on the Indiana Department of Education's website (inview.doe.in.gov), including data broken out by different student populations, such as race, gender, income level, and special education status. Indiana educators and citizens have developed higher academic standards for all students. These standards are necessary to prepare Hoosier students to be successful in life, whether their next steps are enrollment, employment, or enlistment leading to service. For high schools, you will see graduation rates and the percentage of graduates who plan to pursue a credential or certification beyond their high school diploma. Other important data are provided, such as average attendance rates and indicators of school safety, including expulsions and suspensions. In accordance with IC 5-23-5 and Westfield Washington Township Board Resolution 2021-1, the Westfield Washington Township Trustee (‘WWTT’), located in Westfield, Indiana, invites any and all qualified parties to submit Proposals and Statements of Qualifications to design, obtain financing, and construct a new Township Office building to be located in Westfield, Indiana. **II. PROJECT SCOPE:**

Commercial Solar Energy Systems are a minimum of 1/4 acre in total area.  
Geographic Area To Which Ordinance Applies: the entire jurisdiction of the Hamilton County Plan Commission including all zoning classifications. The Plan Commission's jurisdiction applies to all real property located in unincorporated areas in Adams, Noblesville, Wayne, and White River Townships that do not fall under the jurisdiction of another plan commission. **ORDINANCE NO. 12-20-21-A AN**  
**ORDINANCE IMPOSING THE EXTENSION OF THE TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS FOR COMMERCIAL SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEMS**  
WHEREAS, the current Hamilton County Zoning Ordinance does not address Commercial Solar Energy Systems; and  
WHEREAS, the Hamilton County Plan Commission and the Board of Commissioners completed an update to the County's Comprehensive Plan which was adopted on March 23, 2021; and  
WHEREAS, said Comprehensive Plan calls for Hamilton County to adopt an ordinance governing the usage, permissible location, installation, usage, location, operation, maintenance and drainage requirements for Commercial Solar Energy Systems as permitted by IC 36-7-2-2; and  
WHEREAS, said Comprehensive Plan also calls for various other amendments and updates to the Zoning Code; and  
WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has been advised that the Hamilton County Plan Commission has engaged a consultant to assist in drafting various amendments to the Zoning Ordinance; and  
WHEREAS, this will include the adoption of an ordinance addressing regulations for the installation and use of land for Commercial Solar Energy Systems, to be presented to the Board of Commissioners for its consideration; and  
WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners finds that establishing clear rules governing the usage, permissible location, installation, location, operation, maintenance, and drainage requirements for Commercial Solar Energy Systems is essential for the preservation and protection of the public health and safety as permitted by IC 36-7-2-8; and  
WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners finds that the best way to preserve the public health and safety of the citizens of Hamilton County is to extend the temporary moratorium on improvement location permits for Commercial Solar Energy Systems pending adoption of the proposed ordinance amendment.  
WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners and the Plan Commission find that the moratorium is necessary to enable them to prepare and adopt an amendment governing Commercial Solar Energy Systems that incorporates and considers:  
(1) the comprehensive plan  
(2) current conditions and the character of current structures and uses in each district;  
(3) the most desirable use for which the land in each district is adapted;  
(4) the conservation of property values throughout the jurisdiction; and  
(5) responsible development and growth, as required per IC 36-7-4-603, and  
WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners and the Plan Commission adopted a six (6) month moratorium on improvement location permits for Commercial Solar Energy Systems on December 20, 2021, and  
WHEREAS, the Planning Director and other staff have been diligently working with the consultant to complete the required Ordinance; and  
WHEREAS, the Planning Commission anticipates the draft ordinance will be completed in time to considered at its May 18, 2022 meeting, and  
WHEREAS, a properly noticed public hearing will be required as part of the Plan Commission's review and consideration of the ordinance, and  
WHEREAS, it is possible the Board of Commissioners or the Planning Commission will direct that the draft ordinance be amended, and  
WHEREAS, amending, finalizing, and adopting the new ordinance may take more than one meeting by the Plan Commission and/or Board of Commissioners,  
WHEREAS, the possibility of amending the proposed ordinance means that it is possible the approval process will not be completed until June or July; and  
WHEREAS, the current moratorium will expire on May 20, 2022, and  
WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners and the Plan Commission find the moratorium should be extended by ninety (90) days to ensure sufficient time is provided to properly consider, amendment, and adopt the new ordinance; and  
IT IS THEREFORE ORDAINED:  
1. No improvement location permits shall be issued allowing construction of Commercial Solar Energy Systems until the Board of Commissioners adopts an ordinance regulating the installation of Commercial Solar Energy Systems.  
2. For the purposes of this ordinance, "Commercial Solar Energy Systems" shall be defined as: An area of land or other area used by a property owner and/or corporate entity for a solar collection system principally used to capture solar energy, convert it to electrical energy or thermal power, and supply electric or thermal power, primarily or solely for off-site utility grid use, and consisting of one or more free-standing, ground-mounted, solar arrays or modules and/or fuels. Commercial Solar Energy Systems are a minimum of 1/4 acre in total area.  
3. This ordinance shall not apply to any other types of solar collection or solar energy usage.  
4. This Ordinance shall expire upon adoption of an ordinance regulating the installation of Commercial Solar Energy Systems, or July 31, 2022, whichever first occurs.  
5. This ordinance shall be in effect upon adoption.
