General Explanations The APR is a report on the performance of schools and school corporations (districts) in your area. 



WHEREAS, the Hamilton County Plan Commission and the Board of

Commissioners completed an update to the County's Comprehensive Plan which as adopted on March 23, 2021; and

nd updates to the Zoning Code, and WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has been advised that the Hamilton County Plan Commission has engaged a consultant to assist in drafting various
