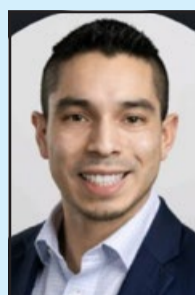

Sarah Shields

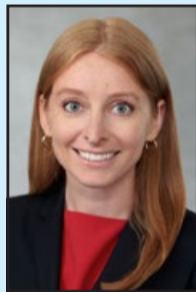
