## Caucus set to replace Sheridan Town Councilman

Levi Schrock has resigned his position on the Sheridan Town Council.

The Hamilton County Republican Party will hold a caucus to select his replacement until the next election. Four precinct committeemen will vote to choose the next Town Council member at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 6 at the offices of Adler Attorneys, 136 S. 9th St., Noblesville. Candidate registration will begin at 5 p.m.

## Property tax relief changes for veterans

House Bill 1210 was signed by Governor Mike Braun on March 12, then becoming Public Law 157. Among other things, that 418-page document has some property tax relief for disabled veterans, and 100-percent relief for 100-percent disabled veterans.

That law increases the property tax deduction for a

veteran who is totally disabled to 100 percent of the assessed value of the individual's real property, instead of \$14,000. It also ends property tax deductions for certain veterans, instead providing a property tax liability credit. It also restores the property tax deduction available to a surviving spouse of a World War I veteran, which was limited by SEA 1-2025.

The law does not go into effect until the 2027 tax bill, and the Auditor's Office is not accepting any deduction forms prior to July 1, 2026. Deductions forms can then be filed through Dec. 30 2026.

Veterans who have a copy of their DD 214 and benefit summary letter that the Veterans Administration mails every year in November can go to the Auditor's Office directly

to apply for the deduction.

Each veteran must follow the instructions to qualify for the Tax Credit with the Hamilton County Tax Authority. If they do not, they will not receive their well-deserved tax credit.

The Hamilton County Veterans Services Office is scheduled to start training sessions for veterans to apply for this credit on June 1.



## Vote411.org offers candidate info & voting reminders

The League of Women Voters of Hamilton County offers a one-stop resource for voters looking for info about the upcoming May 5 primary elections.

Vote411.org is a nonpartisan resource that provides ways to access candidate information and bios and to find polling place locations, among other services.

"Vote411 is the best online election resource for getting your voting plan ready," said Lisa Dick, president of the local league. "One of our group's focuses for primary and general elections is to prepare this guide for all of Hamilton County's voters."

The site launched in time for early voting. The league added its Vote411 banner to the courthouse lawn in Noblesville and placed yard signs at early voting locations. Both feature QR codes that take users directly to the Vote411 website.

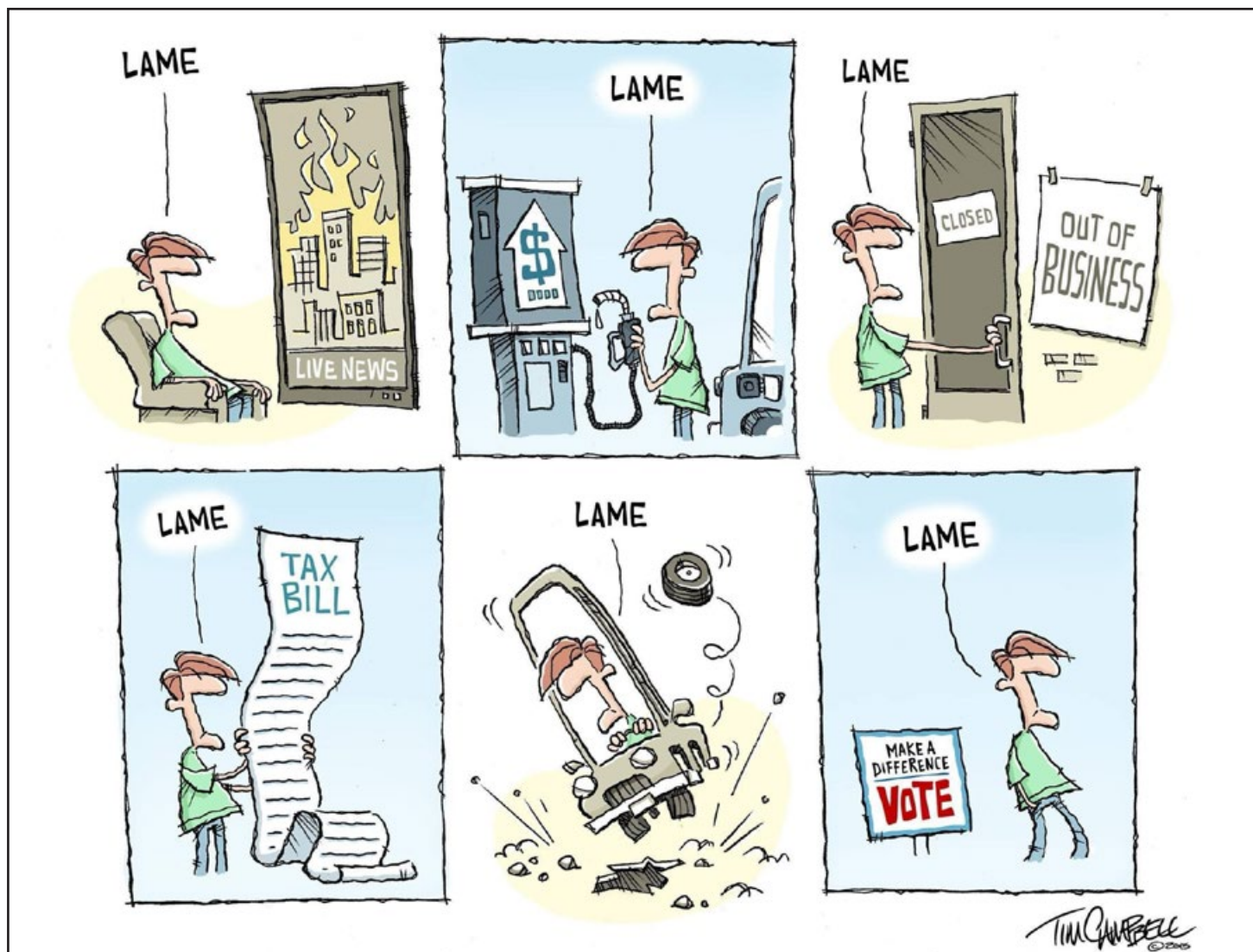
"The Vote411 banner reminds Hamilton County voters that it's time to get a voting plan ready," Dick said, "and the yard signs offer a way for voters in line to check their ballots as they wait. It's important to schedule time to research candidates, plan where and when you will vote, and make sure that your ID is current."

When logging onto Vote411.org, simply enter your address, and all the information on the next page will be tailored to your area. You'll see descriptions of the office, then photos and bios of the candidates who responded to the league's request for info.

Dick added a few reminders for primary voters. Indiana's is a "closed" primary, which means voters select candidates in one party or another. You choose one party to cast all your votes, but you do not have to be a member of that party to choose its ballot.

"In the general election in the fall, you do not have to declare a party and you can vote for anyone on the ballot, regardless of party," Dick explained.
